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ECFE Learning Models and Health Practices 2020-2021

Safety of Students and Staff is our #1 Priority

Mankato Area Public Schools (MAPS) COVID-19 Preparedness Plan has been developed to outline the health and safety expectations that all schools within our district must follow, including our ECFE programs. A few of the items covered within this plan include:

- All Staff and Caregivers must wear a mask while on-site (masks are not currently required for children under age 5)
- Handwashing protocols
- Social distancing guidance
- Daily health checks and monitoring those with symptoms stay home
- · Cleaning and disinfecting protocols for classrooms and learning materials

Overview of ECFE Learning Models for 2020-2021

The 3 learning models outlined below represent the potential scenarios that our ECFE program will move in and out of throughout the school year. Our district leadership will be working in collaboration with Blue Earth and Nicollet County Public Health and MN Department of Education to determine which model is the best fit for our community as we move throughout the year. Our intent is for the ECFE program to align our learning model with preschool and elementary programs within the district. For example, if preschool and elementary programs begin the year in hybrid learning, ECFE programs will begin in this model as well.

Learning Model #1: In-Person Learning

This model is defined as every family attending ECFE classes according to their original program schedule. We are not as bound by the occupancy requirements as we are in a hybrid model (see below). The health and safety measures laid out within the district COVID Preparedness Plan and shared by the MN Dept. of Health will be in place.

- All Staff and Caregivers must wear a mask while on-site (masks are not currently required for children under age 5)
- On-site class attendance will be limited to the enrolled child and one adult caregiver (child care will still be offered)
- Social distancing measures and guidance will be in place and followed to the max extent possible
- Full program fees will apply while participating in the in-person learning model please contact our office if you are interested in learning more about scholarship opportunities

Learning Model #2: Hybrid Learning

This model requires us to operate at 50% building capacity. This capacity takes into account not just the number of children and adults in the room, but also the classroom furnishings to help ensure there is enough space to allow for appropriate social distancing.

- Under the hybrid model, our ECFE program will follow an A/B schedule
- Our classes will be divided in half (group A and group B) and each family will be assigned an alternating schedule that involves on-site program participation one week and distance learning or virtual participation the next
- With only ½ of our families participating on-site at one time, class sizes will be lowered to reduce contact and allow for increased social distancing
- On-site class attendance will be limited to the enrolled child and one adult caregiver (child care will still be offered)
- Distance learning will be synchronous with on-site learning, meaning a video-conference link (e.g., Zoom) will be shared with families so they can participate with their classmates in real-time during circle time and parent discussion
- During the distance learning week, families will pick-up an activity packet with a interactive learning activity that they can complete with their child at home
- Full program fees will apply while participating in the hybrid learning model please contact our office if you are interested in learning more about scholarship opportunities

Learning Model #3: Distance Learning (Whole District)

Following distance learning last spring, we learned from our challenges and will capitalize on our successes. We plan to offer a similar style course with recorded classroom activities for children and shared parent resources delivered through a weekly email. In addition, our team is committed to increasing opportunities for parents to stay connected with each other.

- Routine opportunities will be scheduled for families to engage through facilitated video-conference sessions (e.g., Zoom)
- · Activity packets will be available for families to pick-up and complete with their child at home
- Full program fees will apply while participating in the distance learning model please contact our office if you are interested in learning more about scholarship opportunities

Distance Learning Option

Beginning this fall, many of our core ECFE classes will be offered with a distance learning option (noted on the registration page). Each family will have the option to choose full distance learning if that is their preference. This model can be selected at the time of registration. You will then participate through a distance model regardless of COVID numbers within our community and the current learning model being implemented within the district (in-person, hybrid, distance learning).

- While the district is in hybrid or in-person learning, distance learning will be synchronous (real-time) with our onsite learning
- A video-conference link (e.g., Zoom) will be shared with distance learning families so they can participate with their classmates in real-time during circle time and parent discussion
- Handouts and other information used to facilitate learning and class discussion will be shared by email, along with the meeting link
- · Activity packets will be available for families to pick-up and complete with their child at home
- If the full program were to move to distance learning, all sessions would move to a virtual format as outlined in Model #3: Distance Learning (Whole District)

EARLY CHILDHOOD FAMILY EDUCATION

Early Childhood Family Education provides programming and service to families of young children. Parents and caregivers are critcal to a young child's development and provide a foundation for young learners' success. Early Childhood Family Education is designed to strengthen and support families through facilitation of parent-child activities by a licensed early childhood teacher, and parent discussion facilitated by a licensed parent educator. A variety of classes and outreach activities are offered for families with infants, toddlers, and preschoolers with varied topics and interests.



What does a typical ECFE class include?

Parent-Child Activity Time

Families explore a classroom filled with developmentally appropriate play and learning activities planned by a licensed early childhood teacher. These experiences foster a child's social, emotional, cognitive, physical and language skills.

Parent Education Time

Parents meet with a licensed parent educator to share support, experiences and information about child development and parenting techniques. Research on early brain development, parent-child relationships, child development and guidance techniques are presented in ECFE Classes.

Children's Activity Time

Children learn with the early childhood teacher and paraprofessional, and practice social skills as they interact with one another. READY! FOR KINDERGARTEN

READY! for Kindergarten

READY! For Kindergarten is a program of Mankato Area Public Schools' Early Childhood Family Education Department

What is Ready!? Ready! For Kindergarten provides workshops and take home materials and tools to inspire and empower parents and caregivers to help babies and young children develop strong brain connections that determine how they will think, learn, and grow. Parents and caregivers attend a series of workshops each year, based on their child's age. They learn new skills and helpful tips to nurture development in ways that foster academic skills and personal behaviors to boost children's motivation, perseverance and engagement in learning. Ready! facilitates interactions and active learning by using movement, play, exploration, communication and all of the child's senses-seeing, hearing, smelling, touching, and tasting.

How often do classes meet? READY! for Kindergarten is a series of three parent classes per year (fall, winter and spring) for parents of children aged birth to five. Register for each age group separately.

Who can attend? The parents/grandparents/guardians/care providers of children aged birth to five.

What is the class fee? Fee is charged on a sliding fee scale (\$40,\$30,\$20). Fee includes learning toys for each class.

- Age 4-5: if your child enters Kindergarten in 2021

The purpose of Early Childhood Screening is to...

* Increase parent understanding of child's health, development and school readiness

* Identify conditions and risk factors that may affect a child's ability to learn and develop, make referrals for further assessment

* Link families to parenting resources and preventive health care

A Parent Should Schedule an Early Childhood Screening because....

*It identifies, at an early age, any hearing, vision, growth or development needs.

*It gives the parent valuable information about their child, information about school readiness and community resources.

*It is required by the state of Minnesota before entrance into public school kindergarten.

Earlier is better! The screening changes with the age of your child, so there is no reason to wait.

HOME VISITING

HOME VISITING

Our Early Childhood Family Education Home Visit program is designed to provide individual support to expectant parents and parents of children ages 0–5. Home visits are conducted by a licensed parent educator to help support parents in their role as the first and most important teacher of their child. Parents will gain an understanding of child development and age appropriate behaviors, and receive support with other parenting joys and challenges. For questions and to schedule an appointment with a home visitor, call the Early Learning Department at (507) 625-4620.

- Make connections with other community resources
- Problem solve any questions about family and parenting
- Learn about child development
- Discuss current parenting and family issues based on individual family needs
- Learn ideas and activities that are age-appropriate for a child
- A safe, confidential, environment to share and discuss personal issues related to parenting
- Gain support in the journey of becoming a child's first and most important teacher



Fees are payable by cash, check or credit card. Registrant wishing to withdraw their registration must do so no later than one week prior to the course start date. No refunds will be given if withdraw is made less than one week prior. Scholarships for parent/child classes in the form of a reduced fee or waived fee are available for families in need of financial assistance (one per family).

Please bring a copy of your child's immunization records to the first class. If your child has not been immunized, we will need you to submit a signed exempt form to the Early Learning office.

Sibling care is available for most parent/child classes. Please look at a section that offers sibling care if you require this service. You will register and pay for sibling care at the same time you register for your parent/child class. Fees per semester are \$25 for the first child and \$12 for the each additional child. In addition, we ask that you provide one healthy snack item per term. Drop-in sibling care may be available if the staff-to-child ratio remains safe. Fees are \$4 for the first child and \$2 for each additional child. You must call 48 hours in advance to request drop in care.
